For more than three and a half decades, actor/writer/producer Joey Aresco has been entertaining movie and television audiences with his unique brand of talent. A seasoned veteran actor, Joey has appeared in myriad movies and television programs, many of which have been some of the most loved shows in the history of TV.

From his early guest star roles in 1970s TV classics like "Cannon", "Baretta" and "The Streets of San Francisco", Joey went on to star as Sgt. John David 'Hutch' Hutchinson on the popular TV series "Baa Baa Black Sheep." Since then he has appeared in countless well-known series including "Barney Miller," "Kojak," "Chips," "The Rockford Files," "Taxi," and "Dynasty," to name just a few.
